

## A note from Pastor Phil...

Therefore if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any common sharing in the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, 2 then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind. 3 Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, 4 not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others. -Philippians 2:1-4

Recently I was in a meeting with a group of GMC pastors talking about creating some new processes that would help us to improve the way we work together through the GMC. I think everyone in the conversation understood the problem, but none wanted to name it... except me apparently. We need to set aside our frustrations from the lingering effects of the pandemic. We need to set aside our hurt from the disaffiliation process, and we need to set aside our anxiety about economic inflation... And just do the right things! All this may define our past or current challenges, but it does not define who we are as a church family and Children of God! It is up to us to prepare the way for God's blessings even during challenging times. My clergy friends all looked at me like I grew an extra eyebrow... Then they told me, "Phil, we never need to wonder about what you're thinking, we can trust that you will tell us!" This is very true for me... Anybody who knows me a little knows I do not take hints, I don't read into things, I will always respond to a question with my own thoughts, and I don't worry too much about what others might think... They told me I am a straight talker, which I take as a compliment.

So, this month I just want to share some thoughts with my Church Family about our church. I love this church family with passion and know that God intends to do amazing things here in Manchester.We are not a large community, but we are considered a large church in our conference worshiping greater numbers than many larger communities across the Upper Midwest Conference. We are blessed, and blessed to be a blessing! This means God is not through with us yet! This means we need to continue to prepare the way for the new people and ministries that God is counting on us to engage and fulfill from this unique place in this unique time. And if we are to prepare the way, then there are some things we need to get ready. I am not sure how many followed the UMC General Conference but some have and there is a great exodus in progress from loyal members of UMC churches who now feel hoodwinked that the Book of Discipline was changed dramatically, more than they thought possible... And all avenues to disaffiliate have been closed even though they promised "There will be a better way after the 2024 General Conference!" These refugees from the UMC will come seeking acceptance and care as they struggle with broken relationships and new beginnings. Are we ready to receive them? What about those who do not know hope that Jesus sends into our sphere of influence... Are we ready to receive them? The honest short answer is no... We have some preparations to make, and we need to begin now...

Church, we need folks to volunteer for Hospitality- Greeters, Ushers, and the Welcome desk. This is a ministry that virtually anyone can do from teens to most of our most senior of family members. All that is required is joy, grace, a smile, and a knowledge of where the sanctuary and bathrooms are!

Church, we need folks to join together to focus on Outreach! Folks that can work together to lead the church to come up with activities, processes, to lead our family in reaching out and sharing that these blessings that we know are also for them!

Church, we need folks who like to work with their hands in the gardens! Not just the Vegetable garden in the parking lot, but also the flower gardens around the church. We have a wonderful small group who labor hard, but more are necessary and would be welcome!

Church, we need folks who enjoy media and technology! We do so much with our system around worship and funerals. We have an amazing team that is willing to train those who are interested but we need more people to spread the workload!



### MMC Single Board via e-mails May 2024

Due to weather related issues the May Single Board was conducted remotely. The following business was shared or voted on.

**Finance:** Bruce shared the April Finance Report. Actual expenses for April were \$20,163 and actual income was \$15,705 leaving a shortfall of -\$4,458 for the month. The deficit so far for the year is -\$8,397. The Brick-by-Brick campaign had an additional \$400 donation in April bringing the cash on hand for that account to \$49,042 with no expenses.

**Missions:** The week of June 10 is confirmed for the Paint by Neighbor projects. Projects include construction of the west parking lot fence, installing new flooring at the Rahab house along with other improvements and possibly power washing the tables and chairs from Wesley Hall. The Garden of Hope has been planted. A pancake breakfast is scheduled for June 23 after the nine a.m. service to help support Clarence Slife's son's mission trip to Africa. **Congregational Care:** Our team recently provided food and helped to serve the reception on Confirmation Sunday and also ordered and helped distribute the flowers given out on Mother's Day Sunday.

**Trustees:** The Trustees committee will be using existing funds to construct the west parking lot fence. Measurements have been taken and two bids will be received for this project. The construction will be completed during the week of June 10.

**Staff-Parish:** Shirley has the updated job description for Kat's position and is actively seeking candidates. She has had two inquiries so far and is waiting for further applications before the closing date of June 19. Kat's last day has been revised to August 1st.

The Youth and Family position will be discussed further at the June board meeting. There is concern regarding the financial impact. Zach puts in more hours than he is being compensated for and this will be addressed also in June.

The Board has approved Jean Gross as the lay delegate to the annual conference in June and she will be present remotely to participate. Bill Scanlan is unable to fill this commitment due to health issues at this time. Conference dates are June 13-15.

Questions have arisen over the time commitments from the GMC and we hope to have better clarity after the Annual Conference.

Our next regularly scheduled meeting will be June 18 at 6:00 p.m. in Wesley Hall. Respectfully submitted,

### Update from the Trustees

I think it's safe to say that we have made it through the Covid years and we can try to pick up where we left off with the Brick by Brick Campaign. As you know, we have completed the updating and remodeling of four bathrooms within the church. This was chosen as the first step due to maintenance needs. With supply issues and

rising costs, the project was much more expensive than we had anticipated. However, we are very pleased with the outcome and It's time to move on to the next phase.

Unfortunately, we live in a different world where security issues exist where they didn't before. For this reason, and to take Pastor out of the "fishbowl", we have decided to move the Pastor's office and the Secretary's office downstairs. This will also offer

privacy for counseling and private discussions with the Pastor. This has always been part of the initial Brick by Brick Campaign. The Pastor's office will be in the northwest corner where the treasurer's office is located now. The Secretary's office will be next door where the Youth for Christ office was located years ago. During the week, the main entrance will be the east door located on North Wayne street.

To complete the transition, we will need to do the following:

- Painting
- Floorcovering
- Lighting
- Additional electrical outlets
- A door between the two offices
- Security system and new door for the east entrance
- This door will be locked and the secretary will buzz visitors into the building. This is similar to entrances located at other churches and schools.

Due to your generosity to the Brick by Brick Campaign, we have the funds to cover this phase of the project. Looking ahead to the remaining phases, we will have to seek donations and look into fundraising ideas to complete the restoration and

remodeling of our church.

Hi friends,

My name is Mandy Bieber. I am the Delaware County Emergency Management Coordinator. My job is to help the county prepare for and respond to disasters, and take on projects that will make the next disaster not as bad. I assist with training opportunities and exercises for our county first responders. I am the liaison with the state if we need to bring in outside assistance.

Part of making sure the county is prepared for disaster is making sure our citizens are prepared. I am excited that the congregations of Delaware County are giving me the opportunity to ensure that their members are ready for anything!

Today, we'll start with building the Basic Family Disaster Plan.

Step 1: Discuss the below questions with your family.
How do I receive alerts and warnings?
What is my shelter plan?
What is our plan for communications with each other?
Do I need to create/update my emergency preparedness kit?

Step 2: Consider needs that are specific to your household. Different ages of members within your household Responsibilities for assisting others Locations frequented Dietary needs Medical needs including prescriptions and equipment Disabilities or access and functional needs including devices and equipment Pets or service animals

Step 3: Create your family emergency plan.

Go to <u>https://www.ready.gov/plan-form</u> to fill in your plan.

Step 4: Practice your plan!

Go over the plan with family members to see if it will work, adjust as necessary. If you take these basic steps, you will be more prepared than most people! Thank you, and God bless,

We hope you can join us for a fun filled week as kids and adults alike dive into a friendship with God!

### Volunteers

VBS can't happen without our volunteers, and we are still in desperate need of adults to fill the following roles:

**TIDE POOL PRESCHOOL CREW LEADERS/HELPERS (MS OR HS STUDENTS, ADULTS):** Rather than have our 3 & 4-year-olds rotate through the stations with the older kids, they have their own class. Crew leaders don't need to prepare anything in advance. They'll help their preschool crews follow directions given by Station Leaders. Preschool crew leaders play with children, guide them during activities, and keep them together when they leave the room.

**ELEMENTARY CREW LEADERS (HS Students or Adults):** These individuals are assigned to a group of approximately 5 kids. Crew leaders don't have to prepare anything; they just come each day, guide their crew members through activities, help facilitate discussions, and join in the VBS fun.

**STATION LEADERS (Adults):** Students (who are grouped in crews) move through various stations that are staffed by an adult leader and feature a different Bible-learning activity. You are the "teacher" for your station. Crews are at your station for approximately 20 minutes. Stations include:

**TIDAL TREATS:** This organized individual is in charge of preparing materials and guiding kids through the process of preparing and serving a snack.

**TIDE POOL PRESCHOOL GAMES/CRAFT LEADER:** This patient and creative leader manages materials and guides groups of preschoolers through creating a variety of Bible point reinforcing crafts. This energetic, patient, and organized individual is in charge of leading preschool age kids in fun activities and discussions. You don't need to be an Olympian, you just need to be organized, energetic, and fun loving.
