**Update from Trustees** 

#### A note from Pastor Phil...

5 Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; 6 in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight.

-Proverbs 3:5-6

Recently I was in a meeting with a wonderful, wise and retired pastor named Jim. Jim is the kind of Christian I want to be when I grow up. I found I was immediately drawn to Jim's wisdom, faith, and gentle Christian witness. He said something to me that really shook me to my spiritual core that I have not been able to forget that I wanted to share with you.

"A church should have a greater Purpose than a Preference"

This is the most simple yet profound statements for the church. Churches seem to get consumed by worship styles, worship times, carpet colors, and so many other things that are things we could consider but understand that this there are about personal preferences...but what is our purpose? Our purpose is to go forth and make Disciples. This is the sole purpose of the church. We may accomplish this purpose in part by styles of worship, worship times, and by maintaining our buildings, but none of these things actually make Disciples. Disciples are made in community worship, prayer, small group studies, accountability groups, ministry teams, and fellowship. Each of these helps us to grow deeper in faith and provides for us a greater personal witness. Creating Disciples calls us to prepare as many pathways as we can into the Body of Christ preparing the way for all the souls that Jesus sends us...Those who may not understand our preferences, but just need to connect with the purpose.

In the Proverbs 3:5-6 I believe God's wisdom is revealed. Trust God first, last and always. As a church we should filter all our decisions around this question in all our decisions. How should the church be a good steward around the time, talents, and finances sot that we are focused on the most important thing? Ask this question every time. Is this issue framed around our purpose, or by our preference? How will this decision create opportunities to fulfill our call to make Disciples?

#### **MMC Single Board** April 16, 2024 6:00 p.m. - Wesley Hall

Present: Jean Gross, Bruce Nodurft, Shirley Davis, Wayne Birkenholz, Charles Dighton, Sherry Goranson, Pastor Phil, Mark Reth, Lori Snyder.

Mark opened the meeting followed by a prayer for guidance.

**Finance:** Bruce presented the financial report for March. As of the March 31 the actual expenses for the year have been \$61,590 and actual income has been \$57,655 leaving a deficit of \$4000 YTD. There were \$325 in contributions for the Brick-by-Brick campaign in March. The Global apportionments will be 3% of the previous year's contributions and will be paid on a quarterly basis which amounts to \$591/monthly. This is considerably less than the UMC apportionments.

Trustees: Charlie reported that a bill to Del Co Plumbing in the amount of \$3032.43 will be paid for needed repairs. The city and Oasis completed the water line work. Part of the curb and sidewalk had to be dug up to complete the work. The light in the outside sign has been repaired. Al Saunders will be remodeling the offices. The new front east wing door with an electronic latch will cost \$2500 and has been ordered. It will take three months for the door to come. This work will be completed before the end of the year. The water heater for the bathroom in Fellowship hall has been replaced. Trustees are looking for someone to mow the yard for Rahab House. It is a large lot and we will need a riding mower.

Christian Ed.: The confirmation class will be having a retreat on April 27. We are asked to write a note of encouragement to them to be shared that day. They will be confirmed on Mother's Day, May 12 at first service with a reception to follow in Wesley Hall.

Missions: The mission team is looking for more projects for the Paint by Neighbor week in June. Please let them know of any need in our community. Money has been sent for the Texas wildfire relief as well as the family of Trevor Haar. We are ready to do some planting of early vegetables in the Garden of Hope. **Reaching and Receiving:** Lori has gotten two quotes from two places to do our new church photo book. We will go with the lowest quote and hope to get this process going in the next few weeks. Our last photo book was from 2014, Those who have their pictures taken will receive a photo book with a suggested free will

Congregational Care: Sherry reported they are going to be helping with the confirmation class reception and the flowers for Mother's Day. Carnations will be ordered from the Posy Place. Shirley Haigh is now at the

**SPPRC:** Shirley shared that her team recommended a new position taking the place of our current youth coordinator and called a Director of Youth and Family be considered for later this year. The suggested job description is being shared with the board for review and further discussion at our next meeting. A suggestion of 18-20 hours a week was made at \$18/hour. Zach is currently our youth coordinator being paid \$500/month. Kat's last day of work will be August 1 and we hope to train her replacement for a couple of weeks before she leaves. We will be advertising this position in May.

Motion was made by Bruce, seconded by Charlie that Bill Scanlan be our delegate to the annual

Global Methodist General Conference to be held in Council Bluffs IA. He will be able to attend via Zoom and vote as our lay delegate. Pastor is applying to be a delegate to the National Global Methodist

Conference in Sept. He will be seeking some financial support to attend if he is chosen as a delegate.

We set the date of Saturday morning, May 11 to remove the last of the items of the Remling Estate from the Lahr Auction warehouse to here. We will meet at the church at 9:00. Manpower is needed for that morning. A final decision needs to be made as to where it can be stored for sale. Jean Gross and Darla Gaskill are working on this project.

Our next regularly scheduled board meeting will be May 21 at 6:00 p.m. in Wesley Hall.

#### **Update from the Trustees**

I think it's safe to say that we have made it through the Covid years and we can try to pick up where we left off with the Brick by Brick Campaign. As you know, we have completed the updating and remodeling of four bathrooms within the church. This was chosen as the first step due to maintenance needs. With supply issues and rising costs, the project was much more expensive than we had anticipated. However, we are very pleased with the outcome and It's time to move on to the next phase.

Unfortunately, we live in a different world where security issues exist where they didn't before. For this reason, and to take Pastor out of the "fishbowl", we have decided to move the Pastor's office and the Secretary's office downstairs. This will also offer privacy for counseling and private discussions with the Pastor. This has always been part of the initial Brick by Brick Campaign. The Pastor's office will be in the northwest corner where the treasurer's office is located now. The Secretary's office will be next door where the Youth for Christ office was located years ago. During the week, the main entrance will be the east door located on North Wayne street.

To complete the transition, we will need to do the following:

- Painting
- Floorcovering
- Lighting
- Additional electrical outlets
- A door between the two offices
- Security system and new door for the east entrance
- o This door will be locked and the secretary will buzz visitors into the building. This is similar to entrances located at other churches and schools.

Due to your generosity to the Brick by Brick Campaign, we have the funds to cover this phase of the project. Looking ahead to the remaining phases, we will have to seek donations and look into fundraising ideas to complete the restoration and remodeling of our church.



#### Parish Preparedness by Mandy Bieber, Delaware County Emergency Management



Hi friends,

My name is Mandy Bieber. I am the Delaware County Emergency Management Coordinator. My job is to help the county prepare for and respond to disasters, and take on projects that will make the next disaster not as bad. I assist with training opportunities and exercises for our county first responders. I am the liaison with the state if we need to bring in outside assistance.

Part of making sure the county is prepared for disaster is making sure our citizens are prepared. I am excited that the congregations of Delaware County are giving me the opportunity to ensure that their members are ready for anything!

Today, we'll start with building the Basic Family Disaster Plan.

Step 1: Discuss the below questions with your family.

How do I receive alerts and warnings?

What is my shelter plan?

What is our plan for communications with each other?

Do I need to create/update my emergency preparedness kit?

Step 2: Consider needs that are specific to your household.

Different ages of members within your household

Responsibilities for assisting others

Locations frequented

Dietary needs

Medical needs including prescriptions and equipment

Disabilities or access and functional needs including devices and equipment

Pets or service animals

Step 3: Create your family emergency plan.

Step 4: Practice your plan!

Go over the plan with family members to see if it will work, adjust as necessary.

If you take these basic steps, you will be more prepared than most people!


