MMC Single Board June 18. 2024 5:30 p.m. - Wesley Hall

Present: Jean Gross, Kathy Dolan, Lori Snyder, Sherry Goranson, Wayne Birkenholz, Charles Dighton, Bruce Nodurft, Beth Mueller, Pastor Phil, Mark Reth.

Mark shared scripture from Philippians 4:11-13. God asks us to be content in all circumstances whether we are in need or have plenty. We can do all this through Him who gives us strength. We need to be ready for whatever may come our way.

Finance: Bruce reported at our Y-T-D expenses are \$102,464 and our Y-T-D income is \$89,487. Our deficit is due mainly to salary expenses because of additional part-time staff, staff raises and additional expenses from two services. Giving is about the same as last year but expenses are more. Money has been distributed from the Al Remling estate items sold. Receipts from those items so far amount to \$5,658.31. Distribution of that money is as follows: \$1697.49 to OCC; \$39.61 to Missions; \$118.82 to General Fund and \$3,802.39 to the Building Fund. An additional \$1600 has been received from Lahr Auctions for the final items they sold for us. It will be distributed in the same manner.

Trustees: Charlie reported that work on the new church offices will begin this week. A dumpster is by the east entrance for items that need to be thrown from those rooms and from the construction. Al Saunders will begin his work June 24. It is anticipated it will take a couple of months.

Missions: The Paint by Neighbor crew completed the fence on the west side of the south parking lot. They also did some finishing work on Rahab House. About thirteen people were on the work crew this year. HACAP received the recently collected items. There is a pancake breakfast being served this Sunday June 23 after church to support Bret Slife and his mission trip to Africa.

Reaching and Receiving: Lori reported pictures for the new church directory are going well. Everyone is happy with the process.

Congregational Care: Sherry reported this group helped with ushering on June 16. Cards have been sent and visits made to the Good Neighbor Home and Meadows. We will be looking ahead to the fall birthday celebration with no date set as of yet.

Staff Parish: They will be meeting June 20 to review the applications for Office Manager with a decision to be made soon.

It was decided to have a special single board meeting on June 25 at 5:30 in Wesley Hall to further discuss and make some decisions on the Youth and Family Coordinator position recommendation coming from SPPRC.

Our next regular meeting will be July 16, 2024 at 6:00 p.m. in Wesley Hall.

Mission Project: Making a splash in Honduras!


