It is hard to believe that it is already November! Everyone goes into overdrive preparing for the family festivities of Thanksgiving and Christmas. So much food, fellowship, and fun! What are we thankful for? Surely we are thankful for our family, friends, health, and whatever...but do we continue to bear in mind our thankfulness due to God, who sought us beyond our iniquity to be redeemed in His grace?

MMC Single Board Minutes - October 15, 2024 6:00 P.M. - Wesley Hall

Present: Mark Reth, Bill Scanlan, Bruce Nodurft, Wayne Birkenholz, Charlie Dighton, Lori Snyder, Sherry Goranson, Kathy Dolan, Jean Gross.

Mark opened the meeting with scripture from Matthew 6:5-8 which emphasizes prayer and its "dos and don'ts". The perfect prayer we are taught to pray, "The Lord's Prayer", immediately follows these verses. We are reminded that our Father in heaven knows what we need even before we ask Him. Prayers for guidance and for those needing prayer at this time were lifted up by Mark.

Finance: Bruce shared that as of the end of September our giving is down by -\$26,139 to meet actual expenses. After using the final SCRIP monies our deficit is still -\$4,022. The SCRIP monies are a one time giving and will no longer be available since the program was discontinued. He gave each board member a budget worksheet for next year to see if/where we can make adjustments in staffing or other expenses so we can meet our budgeted needs.

Trustees: Charlie mentioned there has not been much progress with the remodeling project and has recently spoken to Al Saunders about that. Trustees will be adding additional security equipment required for the new offices. Our phone system will be updated as the construction project progresses. We will be switching to Comelec as their rates are better than Windstream. The east sidewalk replacement has been put on hold due to other projects needing attention. Trustees are looking at redesigning the south entry to allow for a walking ramp up to that door. There is not enough room for a wheelchair ramp. Contractors will be asked for bids for this project. Two handicap signs have been placed by the front door. The outlets in Wesley Hall need to be rewired so the breakers are not overloaded. The elevator maintenance contract rates are increasing next year.

Missions: November 10 there will be a Hunter's Brunch between services with the proceeds to go towards hurricane relief through Samaritan's Purse. The November Mission of the Month will also be hurricane relief.

Reaching and Receiving: Lori reminded us about the worship night at Sherman's on Saturday night from 6 to 8 p.m. We are encouraged to attend. OCC will be serving goodies and drinks as a fund raiser. There is a balance of \$1250 in the pictorial directory fund. The pictures are in and will be out on a table Sunday for people to pick up. The directory will be coming hopefully by the end of the year. A free will donation will be asked to cover the expenses for the directory beyond what is in the current fund.

Congregational Care: Sherry mentioned that the 80+ birthday party held recently was a success with a total of 30 people enjoying the meal and the program by Laura Holtz from the Chamber Office. Beth Mueller entertained us with some music. Small hand carved olivewood crosses will now be given to bereaved families as we have no more angel trees available. A pie and card was presented to Pastor Phil in recognition of Pastor Appreciation Month. Marlene Reth continues to visit the Good Neighbor Home and Meadows with the Chimes and Upper Room. Many cards are being sent by the Congregational Care team for various occasions.

Lay Leader: Bill thanked everyone for all the hard work done by the faithful members of our congregation. We are well-known in the community for our outreach and ministry.

Our next meeting will be November 19, 2024 at 6:00 in Wesley Hall. Meeting adjourned at 7:10 with the Lord's Prayer and singing of the Doxology.

Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Tips

Please use one of the red and green GO boxes or a regular size cardboard shoebox.

They are a standard size that packs easily into the shipping cartons at the processing center. While plastic boxes seem practical, many times they break and end up in the "shoebox hospital" at the processing center.



Boy or Girl

Determine the gender and age category: 2-4 years, 5-9 years, or 10-14 years. Attach the appropriate label (from the OCC pamphlet) on the box lid. Once the box is full, put a rubber-band around the box.

Gifts

Please focus on the practical! This one box will be shared with all members of the child's home, neighbors, friends, etc. The one washcloth you include may be used by 10 people living with the child! The simple items you take for granted each day could make all the difference in this child's life! Below are some ideas to get you started.

Non-liquid Hygiene items (These items will be shared by everyone living with the child. That could be 10-20 people!)

- Toothbrush
- Mild bar soap (leave in packaging; Ivory is a great choice because it floats)
- Comb
- Washcloth
- Stick deodorant
- Non-liquid lip balm
- Adhesive bandages
- Nail clippers & file

School Supplies (These could mean the difference in whether or not the child gets to attend school.)

- Pens
- Pencils (sharpen beforehand if possible) & sharpener
- · Crayons or markers
- Paper (Steno notebooks fit well in shoeboxes)
- Solar calculator
- Scissors
- · Glue sticks

Clothing/Accessories

- Shirts (plain colors)
- Pants
- Shorts
- Shoes
- Socks
- Underwear
- Hats/mittens
- Hair bows
- Jewelry

Other

- Flashlights & batteries (This could be lifesaving for children escaping war or domestic violence)
- Sunglasses
- Tools (no saws or pocketknives)
- Duct tape
- Sewing kit/fabric
- Cups, bowls, empty water bottle
- Fishing kit

Toys/WOW item (Focus on the practical but still include a few fun items)

- Balls (even a deflated soccer ball with a hand pump)
- · Stuffed animal
- Small cars
- Yo-yos
- Jump ropes
- Harmonicas
- Puzzles
- Binoculars

DO NOT INCLUDE:

- Used/damaged items
- War-related items (toy guns, knives, military figures, or any action figure holding a weapon)
- Candy, chocolate, or any type of food (could melt or spoil)
- Toothpaste (won't get through customs)
- Liquids/lotions (containers can break ruining other items in the box)
- Medications/vitamins
- Breakable items (snow globes, glass containers, etc.)
- Aerosol cans



except for the last Sunday of each month. If you've ever thought about joining us, please give it a try! We'd love to have more voices to help us "make a joyful noise"!


