#### A note from Pastor Phil...

In the Book of Acts chapter 6, we find the twelve original Disciples overwhelmed with the demands of ministry and have appointed another seven Disciples to take on some of the ministry demands so that they could continue to preach and teach, seeking new believers to be saved. In Acts chapter 7, we read about one of these newly chosen seven, named Stephen - being stoned for his teaching of Jesus by a mob led by the Pharisee Saul - who would eventually go on to become the Apostle Paul after an encounter with the Holy Spirit on a road trip to Damascus. After this, many of the early Christian church fled Jerusalem to avoid similar martyrdom. Another of these newly appointed Disciples is named Philip, known as the Evangelist (not to be confused with Philip, one of the original twelve Disciples.) Philip the Evangelist traveled to Samaria and started a new church with fiery preaching that caused the church to grow and bloom. The growth of the church was so incredible that the leaders in Jerusalem sent the Apostle Peter to see for himself and provide encouragement. Philip had become something of a local celebrity and the church was flourishing. I am sure the folks in the church felt specially blessed. Now let us look into the scripture that immediately follows;

<sup>26</sup>Now an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Go south to the road - the desert road - that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." <sup>27</sup>So he started out, and on his way he met an Ethiopian eunuch, an important official in charge of all the treasury of the Kandake (which means "queen of the Ethiopians"). This man had gone to Jerusalem to worship, <sup>28</sup>and on his way home was sitting in his chariot reading the Book of Isaiah the prophet. <sup>29</sup>The Spirit told Philip, "Go to that chariot and stay near it."

<sup>30</sup>Then Philip ran up to the chariot and heard the man reading Isaiah the prophet.

"Do you understand what you are reading?" Philip asked.

<sup>31</sup>"How can I," he said, "unless someone explains it to me?"

So he invited Philip to come up and sit with him. - Acts 8:26-31

It is important to note that when the Holy Spirit (Angel of the Lord) spoke, Philip did not hesitate but followed the divine instructions, left his successful ministry and went alone into the desert. There he encounters a man reading scripture. It just so happens the eunuch is reading Messianic prophecy from the Book of Isaiah in the Septuagint (the Greek Old Testament). Pay close attention to verses 30-31. Do you understand the Word of God? How can I, without explanation? Is this any less true today?

During the COVID-19 Pandemic lockdown, this church responded by seeking out a way to continue to share the Good News through our local radio station, KMCH. We broadcast our Sunday worship services every Sunday night at 6:00 P.M. This helped us engage our congregation who did not have the ability to participate in our worship services online.

#### A note from Pastor Phil...

Since the lockdown ended, we have maintained our worship presence, inviting all to join us who are not able to come in person or view it online. I have heard many times from people in our community that this radio offering is well received and serves as the worship service for many of our neighbors near and far. God has used this modern form of communication to be glorified for many who would otherwise not hear the Good News.

This last year with our economy being such a challenge for so many of our church family, we find that our ministry dollars are stretched and that we might be forced into making some financial compromises. Our Single Board members - acting in accordance with their responsibilities - began to question if radio worship is still something that we need to do, with both live and online worship opportunities offered every week. I support that this question is responsible, but personally feel that we have established a radio worship community and would like to continue to support them. The decision was made to seek individual sponsorship for the radio ministry, at a cost of \$75 per week.

Debbie and I have felt truly blessed ever since we moved to the Manchester community and began our ministry together here at Manchester Methodist Church. It has really become our "home town." We also thank God for all the pastors that have shared in their ministry here that prepared the way for us to be welcomed and successful. As it happens I actually know a few of them personally. So Debbie and I are going to fund all the radio costs for the month of January 2025 in honor of the ministry here of my colleagues and friends, Rev. Jim Hanke, Rev. Dave Wagner, Rev. Roger Henry, and Rev. Mike Druhl. I want to thank them for preparing the way.

In our story above, Philip shared with the eunuch the Good News of the gospel and the salvation promised in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The eunuch was so moved that when they came to a small pond he requested Philip to baptize him in the waters. Then Philip and the Eunuch parted ways. Many years later, as the church mission moved into Ethiopia, they were surprised to find an active and healthy church of believers already praising and worshiping Jesus Christ as Redeemer and Savior. I wonder if Philip ever knew the true influence revealed that day sharing the gospel with a stranger.

## MMC Single Board Meeting Minutes December 17, 2024 ~ 6:00 P.M. ~ Wesley Hall

**Present:** Jean Gross, Kathy Dolan, Shirley Davis, Lori Snyder, Charlie Dighton, Wayne Birkenholz, Bill Scanlan, Bruce Nodurft, Mark Reth, Pastor Phil Rogers, Beth Mueller.

Mark called the meeting to order followed by a prayer for guidance from Pastor Phil. Mark shared a brief devotional from Ecclesiastes 7:8 "Better is the end of a thing than its beginning, and the patient in spirit is better than the proud in spirit." He shared some personal thoughts on this scripture.

**Prayers and praises** were lifted up followed by prayer for healing.

**Finance:** Bruce shared that our deficit as of the end of November is -\$9,639. He acknowledged a substantial gift has been recently given to help with the shortfall. He also said Connectional giving will be paid quarterly rather than monthly.

**Trustees:** Charlie reported on the progress made for the new offices. They should be painted later this week. The carpet tile has been picked out from Kluesner Flooring. New security equipment will be required for the offices including the east entrance door. The remodel of the south entrance should happen next year. Supreme Green has been contracted for snow and ice removal. The broken windows on the east side of the church have been fixed by Palmer Hardware.

**Worship:** Beth shared that the choir will be singing a song at Dr. Tyrrell's funeral on January 4. He was a choir member for many years.

**Missions:** \$1,000 from the Ice Cream Social proceeds will be sent to "Faith Responders" for hurricane relief. Our annual Soup Supper is scheduled for Wednesday, January 15. Sign-up sheets will be posted for food needed plus Silent Auction items. We will have a freewill offering. Proceeds will be sent to "Convoy of Hope", a disaster relief organization based in Missouri. They have also provided much relief to recent hurricane victims.

**Reaching and Receiving:** Lori will order 200 copies of our new church directory today at a cost of \$1,750. There are almost enough funds donated for this project to defray the cost, but a free will offering would be appreciated.

**Congregational Care:** This team met recently and addressed over 100 Christmas cards to be sent to our church family. A donation of stamps was acknowledged. We will meet in January to start planning our Valentine's get-together.

**Lay Leader:** Bill thanked everyone for their valuable leadership on our Board.

**Action Item:** Motion by Wayne, seconded by Charlie to continue with our legal representation through NCLL in the amount of \$1,000, plus some possible additional fees for 2025, and pay for this out of the Rahab account as that mission project moves ahead. Motion carried.

**Action Item:** A recommendation from Finance to approve the 2025 budget was brought forward. After some discussion and a few minor changes, the 2025 budget was approved unanimously.

Our next regular board meeting will be Tuesday, January 21, 2025. Meeting adjourned at 8:00 p.m. We closed with the Lord's Prayer and singing of the doxology.
